## Are You Planning an Event at the Church?

The church secretary will make sure the space is available, reserve your event on the church calendar, and make arrangements to check out a church key to the group leader. After your event, you are responsible for returning all furniture and items to where they came from, and cleaning up after your group.

If you are planning a private event, please complete a "Facility Use For Non-Affiliated Groups" form (available from the church office or on the church website under the "News & Events" tab). Submit the completed form to the church office at least two weeks prior to the event. The event must be approved by the events team leader before it is officially scheduled on the calendar. There is usually no charge for a church member to use church facilities. You may request that the custodian

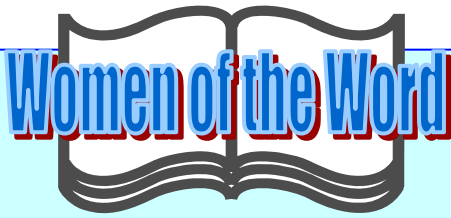

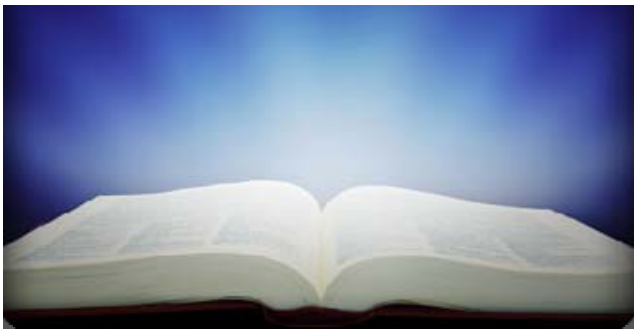
